## ORDER

On September 12, 1984, the intervenors filed a motion with the Licensing Board seeking to reopen the record in this operating license proceeding for the purpose of "includ[ing] the Byron station design as an issue." As matters now stand, the Licensing Board's jurisdiction over the proceeding is limited to the matters remanded to that Board in ALAB-770, 19 NRC \_\_\_\_ (May 7, 1984). We entertain considerable doubt that the issue sought to be raised by the intervenors' motion comes within the scope of the remand, which was confined to questions relating to "whether, notwithstanding quality assurance deficiencies, reasonable assurance exists that the Byron facility has

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been properly constructed." ALAB-770, 19 NRC at \_\_\_,
n.72.1/ Nonetheless, we believe it appropriate for the
Licensing Board to consider the motion in the first
instance and, thus, hereby authorize it to do so.
