Inspection Summary

Inspection Conducted May 4-8, 1992 (Report 50-482/92-10)

Areas Inspected: Routine, unannounced inspection of the physical security program. The areas inspected included: management support, security program plans and audits; protected and vital area barriers and isolation zones; protected area access control of personnel, packages, and vehicles; alarm station and communications; testing, maintenance, and compensatory measures; security training and qualification; security locks, keys and combinations; records, and reports.

Results: Within the areas inspected, no violations or deviations were identified. One concern was identified involving vital area barriers which is

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discussed in paragraph 3.2.b. The following is a summary of the inspection results:

- The security program was well managed and received very good management support.
- Security organization personnel were motivated, well managed, and appeared capable of performing to licensee requirements.
- The preventive maintenance program for security equipment was well implemented and a formal schedule was being followed.
- The security training program was a well rounded program with very good documentation. Training aids were readily available and used effectively.
- The firing range program was ressive, and the various training aids and facilities at the range a great deal of self initiative by the security organization.
- The security locks, keys, and combinations program was effective.
- The required records and reports were all in order, a good analysis of events was being performed, and sound corrective actions were being implemented.
- The security audit program was comprehensive and performance oriented.
- A concern was identified regarding the number of unsecured vital area doors. Aggressive corrective actions had been implemented by the licensee concerning this matter prior to this inspection.

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
