Dear Mr. Denton:

This letter provides updated information regarding the use of shift advisors during the startup of Byron 1. These revisions to the information provided in reference (a) have already been discussed with the NRC staff. With these revisions, we understand that our shift advisor program is acceptable and we will continue to implement it.

Byron's shift advisor program has recently been evaluated by a Utility Shift Advisor Program Evaluation Team. Their comments and recommendations have been incorporated into certain station procedures. Five additional people have also been added to the shift advisor program since our previous correspondence with the NRC on this topic. Several of the appendices to reference (a) therefore need to be updated. The appendices to this letter are identified as follows:

- (1) Appendix B provides resumes and a copy of the operator license for each Shift Advisor.
- (2) Appendix C provides those procedures which have been revised to incorporate the Evaluation Team comments.
- (3) Appendix D provides those training program procedures which have been revised to incorporate the Evaluation Team comments.
- (4) Appendix E provides an update of the exam grades for the additional Shift Advisors.

The procedures provided here are the current versions and may be revised. Future revisions will not be submitted but the current version will always be available for NRC review.
