EMERGENCY EVACUATION MEETING #6 SEPT 6, 1984 (7:30-9:30)

Committee members present:

Tyrone Johnson, Nancy Catton, Frank Panala, Jim Brown, Nancy Koehler, Jackie Crahalla

Committee members absent:

Lee Seitz, Dick Oesterling, Carl Dadonna, John Rafferty, Flaine Graham, Les Carlton

Each member of the committee present was provided with the most recent draft of the evacuation map for the area. The meeting started with a discussion about the degree of imformation that should be made public. Jim Brown suggested that con the members not discuss the business of our meetings with members of the press, but rather refer them to him. By the same token, it was noted that members should not feel that these are "secret" meetings and may discuss them in an informal manner. It was "secret" meetings and may discuss them in an informal manner. It was also restated that this committee will simply make recommendations as to the district's evacuation plan, and not specifically design the plan itself.

Members who were present agreed to set a deadline for November 15 for final recommendations in the hope that this information can be presented to the school board in December. It was noted that a survey of bus drivers should be conducted, and that it will take significant time to accomplish. Dr. Warner has stated he would not like to survey the professional staff. Jim Brown shared that committee members would simply be editing the existing plan, rather than rewriting the entire plan. Jim also shared that Dr. Warner was not contacted during the public drill which was held in July. He also stated that he will be meeting in the next week or so with Tyrone Johnson to update bus routes from schools within the EPZ to Norristown Area District.

The draft of the plan was examined from pages 27-the end of the plan. Frank Panaia raised questions (p 27) as to whether having teachers stay beyond the end of the school day would be contracted as opposed to a special duty assignment. Frank also raised problems with usage of the word "assign" (p 27). Nancy Koehler stated that use of or the idea of including emergency assignments might be included as a separate item in teacher contracts.

Jim Brown shared that the District is looking into the possibility of setting up a computer center at the administration building with separate terminals in each building. This system could be used to alert principals in emergency situations. Tyrone Johnson was concerned about power failures and also inquired about radio systems. It was agreed upon by those present that we should explore the possibility of some type of radio system alert. Tyrene notes that presently there is no standby generator at the bus garage and communications systems' within the buses have only one frequency. Jim noted that in emergency situations informal means of communication are often times the most successful. Frank suggested the possibility of looking at limited scanners in each school. It was noted this would not be costly. Nancy Catton expressed concern about the idea of PECO paying for these extra expenses. Jim stated this might be looked at under the area of "unmet needs" of the district. At this point, it seems that the most tangible need may be for additional buses. Nany Catton also asked about insurance coverage during an emergency.

Frank Panaia expressed concerns about activities in progress when school is not in session, such as after school sports. Jim noted that the superintendent would contact the director of activities and in turn this individual would be aware of different teams and locations and arrange to have buses. Frank specifically asked about sporting events that are away. Jim noted that the director of activities would need to be addressed on this issue:

At this point, it looks as though students from elementary schools and Arcola will be bussed to Norristown High School. If necessary a second wave of evacuation could involve students from the junior and senior highs. The time frame needs to be clarified as far as how long a host school would be providing this service.

Tyrone Johnson noted that the district's smaller buses and vans are not listed as possible transportation in an emergency. Jim reiterated that we proceed as a committee under the assumption that we will be going to Norristown High School as our host school. He noted that the district does not have enough buses to evacuate elementary and Arcola as well as junior and senior high students if they were to be included in an initial evacuation plan. More buses would be needed to evacuate them on a later run.

Polling the teachers and other staff, in addition to the bus drivers, is still a possibility. This, of course, is subject to Dr. Warner's approval. Jackie Crahalla noted that total honesty on the part of any staff members would be vital in this survey. Jim made a point that we need to get our information together before we do polling of other groups. He shared the concerns raised by Owen J Roberts district when they, perhaps prematurely, surveyed staff members.

Tyrone raised the issue of possible availability of additional drivers if our district did not have sufficient drivers. Jim stated that the driver issue should be dealt with prior to the teachers since teachers could possibly have to supervise up to 200 students at differenct grades than what they are used to dealing with.

In going through the plan, it was noted that it was not necessary to have multiple copies of the same map within the plan, which cut down on the length of the plan itself. The sample letter #1 was specifically modified by committee members. Jackie Crahalla raised a concern about parents picking up students at school. It was noted that there would have to be a release form provided, particularly if someone other than a parent picked up. Traffic control will also be a problem since bus access routes must be kept open. Jim shared that at Owen J Roberts they are planning on using maintenance and custodial personnel for traffic control. Questions were also raised about the role of the Red Cross at the feeding center would be. There were also questions raised (p A41) as to the disposition of students not in EPZ schools.

It was noted for the next meeting on September 25 (7:30) that we will go over the second sample letter and complete specific recommendations for the plan.

Mr. Lee Seitz, assistant principal at the senior high, has been dropped from the committee since he has been unable to attend any of the 6 meetings thus far.
