Dear Dr. Karam:

In accordance with the Commission's rules and regulations and your September 26, 1984 application requesting authorization to dismantle your AGN 201 reactor and to eventually terminate your license, the enclosed notice will be published in the Federal Register.

We have reviewed your discussion of the low-enriched AGN fuel, and concur with you that temporary storage of that fuel in the GTRR storage vault is consistent with the current licenses of both reactors, including the provisions for physical security. Therefore, you may relocate the fuel at any time. However, because you will still possess the AGN fuel under your license No. R-111, that license cannot be terminated until you either have disposed of the fuel or transferred possession to your license No. R-97. As Robert Carter, our Project Manager for your facility, has discussed with you, you must initiate a request for amendment to license No. R-97 to effect such a transfer.
