MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission has under review an application for a construction permit for the proposed Jamesport Nuclear Power Station; and,

WHEREAS, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, in consultation with the New York State Historic Preservation Officer, has determined that this undertaking as proposed would have an adverse effect upon the Hallock's Pond archeological site, Suffolk County, New York, a property determined by the Secretary of the Interior to be eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places; and,

WHEREAS, the New York State Historic Preservation Officer has determined that this undertaking as proposed would have an adverse effect upon the Northville Historic District, a property determined by the Secretary of the Interior to be eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1(3) of Executive Order 11593, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission has requested the comments of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the procedures of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (36 C.F.R. Part 800), representatives of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, and the New York Historic Preservation Officer have consulted and reviewed the undertaking to consider feasible and prudent alternatives to avoid or satisfactorily mitigate the adverse effect; now,

THEREFORE:

It is mutually agreed that implementation of the undertaking, in accordance with the stipulations contained in the attached letter of May 10, 1976, from William H. Regan, Jr., Chief of Environmental Projects Branch 3, Division of Site Safety and Environmental Analysis, Nuclear Regulatory Commission, will satisfactorily mitigate any adverse effects on the above mentioned properties.
