Dear Sir:

By letter dated December 13, 1391, the NRC issued Inspection Report No. 50-269/91-31, 50-270/91-31, and 50-287/91-31 with a Notice of Violation. Pursuant to the provision of 10 CFR 2.201, a written response to the violation identified in the above inspection report was submitted February 18. 1992.

Within the violation response, Oconee committed to remove and dispose of contaminated asphalt located in high traffic areas within the protected area. This was to be completed by September 1, 1992.

This letter is to advise you that the contaminated asphalt has been removed and placed in approved containers. These containers will be buried in the Oconee Site Landfill upon receipt of a permit from the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control. It is anticipated that the permit will be received and the material buried by March, 1993. Until the permit is received, the containers are being controlled in a locked radioactive material storage area.
