Vogtle Electric Generating Plant Fitness for Duty Program

The data generated under the Fitness For Duty program from January 1992 through June 1992 has been reviewed and analyzed.

The random pool contains not only those badged for unescorted access, but also those who may, in an emergency condition, be called upon to work at the site and may require unescorted access. Contractors without approved programs are included in the test pool while on site. Testing is performed on a nominal weekly basis to include swing shifts, weekends and holidays at a rate which will equal 100% yearly of the total population.

In summarizing management actions associated with the Fitness For Duty program, management actions relative to determination of fitness for duty have been limited to the confirmed positive test results identified by the program on regular full time employees. Contractor employees screened as positive are desired access and no further action is taken.

Management actions during the reporting period involved three licensee employees. The three employees who tested positive had their access suspended and were referred to the Employee Assistance Program (EAP). After full evaluation and rehabilitation, all three were returned to work, had their access restored and each was entered in a follow-up testing pool.

Effective June 1, 1992 the Fitness For Duty substance panel for urine was changed to screen exclusively for the NIDA 5 panel as outlined in 10 CFR Part 26. Barbiturates and benzodiazepines were dropped from the screening and confirmation process. The NRC was previously informed of this change by letter dated May 12, 1992.
