JANUARY 1, 1992 THROUGH JUNE 30, 1992

In the first half of 1992, there were two for-cause tests administered. One individual was a licensee employee that had the odor of alcohol but whose intoxilyzer results were not above 0.04% BAC. This individual was referred to the Site Employee Assistance Counselor for counseling and assessment. The second individual was a long-term contractor employee that was tested because of inattentiveness. This drug and alcohol was negative and there was no referral to the Site Employee Assistance Counselor.

Positive Tests resulting in failures of the Fitness For Duty Program are as follows:

Marijuana -	4
Cocaine -	3
Alcohol -	<u>2</u>
TOTAL	9

Failure of the Fitness For Duty Program resulted in denial of access for contract employees and termination for licensee employees.

There were six individuals who requested an appeal with a review by the Management Review Panel. They requested a review of test data and a reconsideration of the decision to deny access to the South Texas Project Electric Generating Station. The test data was found to be valid and the denial of access remained.
