ODOM: The statement there about diesel starts . . . MOSBAUGH: Yeah?

ODOM: They're having - Chaffee basically said, "That's not a correct statement." And then Brockman said -and chaffee said, "I remember a couple of weeks ago we were hearing about this not being correct." And Brockman spoke up and said, "Yeah. You heard it from the Region." And that's all he said. I thought he was going to help us out by what Brockman had been talking to, you know.

MOSBAUGH: Uh-huh.
ODOM: And that's all he said. So they -- whether they say anything more or not, I don't know; but they picked up on that statement, and they were making an issue for (inaudible), you know.

MOSBAUGH: Huh.
ODOM: You might want to tell John [Aufdenkampe] if you would that that statement where, you know, we struggled with that that statement in there . . . .

MOSBAUGH: Uh-huh.

ODOM: Is that it -- it's getting a little more attention by the IIT (inaudible). MOSBAUGH: Huh. ODOM: I don't know if they're going to do anything with it or not. MOSBAUGH: Alright. ODOM: They know that something's not right on that statement, you know, and er . . . .

MOSBAUGH: It's more than not right. ODOM: Yeah, I know. MOSBAUGH: I -- I'm not done, but I'm looking at the -- see, Kenny just got the logs . . . . ODOM: Yeah. MOSBAUGH: sent to him, and I reviewed a little bit of that with him yesterday. We're going to do some more, but I think we've got a real problem.
(Inaudible.)

ODOM: Well, the other problem with
(inaudible) the LER. I don't have it in front of me now. But it talked about a fuel oil annunciator coming in, a lube oil alarm and a fuel oil.

MOSBAUGH: That's correct.
ODOM: They're saying --
MOSBAUGH: That's in the log somewhere. ODOM: They're saying . . . They don't recall ever hearing that before.

MOSBAUGH: Uh-huh. That's in the log.
That's written up in the critique 10 g . ODOM: They didn't recall that. . . .

BEACHER: Fuel oil was one of the ones they picked up. ODOM: Right. And the start phrase -BEACHER: "Eighteen starts with no problem" -- he said that he had heard that before, and he thinks that's not true.

ODOM: Brockman spoke up and said --
BEACHER: Brockman spoke up -- spoke up

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and made a comment that --
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ODOM: "You heard it from us."
BEACHER: Yeah, "you heard it from us."
ODUN: (inaudible.)
BEACHER: He said he was going to check
into it.
ODOM: Like I say then they said -- then Brockman -- then Chaffee said, "Well, I know something's not right about that." And he said, "We're going to check into that." (Inaudible.) What I'm trying to say is that was in the LER. MOSBAUGH: Yeah. Well, its worded different ways, whether it's in the response to the confirmation of action letter -ODOM: Right, the April (inaudible).

MOSBAUGH: -- or George's presentation in the Region.

BEACHER: Yeah, Lewis Ward . . .
MOSBAUGH: I brought it up with them, and I told Shipman; and I said, you know, "This is not true."

ODOM: Yeah.
MOSBAUGH: "You guys better check your facts." And I gave him specific data on dates and times that -- where I was aware that we had known faisures.

ODOM: Oh, yeah. This is . . . I wish that . . . .
You know that day we had a real sensitive issue with the thing . . . they were picking up . . . .

MOSBAUGH: They blew it off.
ODOM: I thought they did, too, I heard. I heard the Region was contacted and said, "okay, we underctand."

MOSBAUGH: I was on the phone with the whole thing. They blew it off.

ODOM: And they might blow it off now, but this IIT team --

MOSBAUGH: No. What I mean is they -- I mean SONOPCO blew it of $f$. onom: oh, okay.

MOSBAUGH: I'm not saying the NRC blew it off.

ODOM: I heard that we contacted Brockman personally --

MOSBAUGH: McCoy came back on the conversation on the phone and said, "Yeah, I just talked to Ken Brockman, and he understands that there were failures in the process of coming out of the maintenance on the machine." okay. Well, that may be, okay. There were failures coming out of the maintenance on the machine, okay, but there were also failures in a period of time that I considered to be beyond the maintenance on the machine.

ODOM: Okay.

## MOSBAUGH: Okay?

BEACHER: They want to talk with the guy who actually did the work on those valves, the accumulator installation valve, the charging and pump valve. They want to talk with Mike Kagel again concerning installation of the hatch, pressurizing manway. I guess what they're gettina at -- getting at is how the communication related. It appears as though Hopkins told Mike Kagle (inaudible).

WEBB: Brockman knows (inaudible).
ODOM: I just told Allen they were hitting on that. They were really focused on that.

WEBB: I thought Brockman was going to explain it to them.

ODOM: I thought he was going to help us out.

WEBB: He didn't --
ODOM: He said, "What you heard -- where the problem was -- is from the Region." And he dropped it, right there. And that's all he said. You know, like, come on, Ken, speak up. Tell us some more --

VOICE: Another question --
ODOM: -- if you do, help us out here (chuckling). VOICE: (inaudible) we explained (inaudible).

ODOM: And he just -- I thought Bob was going to bail us out too with that one, (inaudible) explain it, Allen. I know Mccoy talked to him; that's what I heard.

WEBB: And these fellows observed that the jacket water pressure was 12 to 13 pounds. They asked if that was when the diesel was running or after a trip. I said, "Well, the way it reads, I think it's after the trip."
voICE: It sounds a little better if they are convinced that it was after the trip. He said okay.

ODOM: That's the way he understood it, too. Okay. Well listen, if you want to run, keep me informed of that call; and I'll consider two or three ears for that phone call today (inaudible)?

BEACHER: Uh-huh.
ODOM: And er . . .
MOSBAUGH: (inaudible).
ODOM: And uh, I wish these guys would
just go away, man.
MOSBAUGH: Uh-huh.
BEACHER: (Inaudible) calcon switches when they did the, er, data (inaudible) on three sets of data taken, which we told them --

ODOM: Yes, it was
BEACHER: -- yes, it was taken. However, now they want to see the dog-gone data.

ODOM: They're the same.
BEACHER: I know. They say its the same, but where is it? We want to see the actual. . . .

ODOM: We've given it to them. It's for the same data.
