Docket No. 50-155 - License DPR-6 - Big Rock Point Nuclear Plant RESPONSE TO INTERIOR DEPARTMENT COMMENTS ON BIG ROCK POINT NUCLEAR PLANT ENVIRONMENTAL REPORT

We appreciate the comments of the Department of Interior and concur with their recommendations for additional review of then-current Federal and State of Michigan listings of threatened and endangered species prior to initiating decommissioning activities which could endanger listed species. This process is consistent with the future survey plans we discuss in Section 3.2.3 of the Environmental Report.

Consumers Power Company maintains close contact with both Federal and State authorities with respect to listed species and the rules governing their protection. Such routine communications are required in the course of business which involves state-wide activities at nuclear, fossil and hydro facilities, as well as electric and gas transmission and distribution work. This routine interaction will continue throughout the decommissioning process.

With respect to the recommendation for periodic inspections and maintenance of fuel storage and hazardous material facilities, Consumers Power company is committed to these activities. Radiological and non-radiological source monitoring will continue throughout the SAFSTOR interval as discussed in Environmental Report Section 4. In addition technical specifications will identify specific surveillance requirements which are applicable to decommissioning.

The Department of the Interior has reviewed the Environmental Report for the Decommissioning of Big Rock Point Nuclear Plant Project, Charlevoix County, Michigan prepared by Consumers Power Company (CPC) for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and has the following comments.

Endangered Species Act

Our U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) concurs with the identification on pages 3-18 and 3-19 in the report of Federally listed species that may presently occur at the project site. As pointed out in the document, CPC will not implement most of the proposed actions for several years. Therefore, the Service recom. ends that CPC request a species list from the Service's East Lansing Field Office and conduct surveys for listed species prior to initiating any decommissioning activities.

The document states that spent fuel will be stored for more than 20 years under the proposed alternative. Accordingly, we recommend that CPC conduct periodic inspections and maintain the integrity of all structures that contain hazardous materials as long as necessary, as well as conduct radiological monitoring during the wet and dry dormancy periods. The decommissioning process should proceed as safely as possible due to the potential for contamination of Lake Michigan waters and sensitive Great Lakes shoreline habitat.

If the project is modified or new information about the project becomes available that indicates listed or proposed species may be affected, CPC should reinitiate consultation with the Service. The Service further advises that should it list or propose to list any species occurring in the project area as a threatened

or endangered species prior to completion of the project, the Federal project sponsor, the NRC, would also be required to reevaluate its responsibilities under the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended. Since data on threatened and endangered species is updated continually, the Service recommends that CPC request annually an updated Federal list of the species occurring in the project area. In addition, we also recommend that CPC contact the Michigan Department of Natural Resources for information on state-listed species in the project area and review its responsibilities pursuant to State of Michigan Public Act 204 (Endangered Species Act of 1974). The State Endangered Species Act requires permits in advance of any work that could potentially damage, destroy, or displace state-listed species.

We hope these comments will be helpful to you.
