In a recent review of our records, we identified that we did not respond to you regarding a concern that you brought to our attention on June 17, 1993. Your concern involved one of the two main evacuation routes for the Oyster Creek Nuclear Generating Station, out of Lacey Township, NJ, which would be closed for at least 45 days to replace a bridge. Specifically, you wanted to know why a temporary bridge was not being installed in the interim.

The NRC senior resident inspector (SRI) visited the bridge construction site on June 25, 1993. The SRI found that a temporary bridge was installed and appeared to be well supported and easily passable. The intent of the temporary bridge was to use it only for emergency purposes. If an evacuation was necessitated, police would remove the barricades and monitor the traffic across the temporary bridge.

The permanent bridge has been repaired and was reopened on September 27, 1993. We apologize for not getting in touch with you sooner. However, we did verify that the road was accessible and that appropriate action was taken to ensure admittance through the temporary bridge.
