SHUTDOWN AND REFUELING MAINTENANCE OPERATIONS

This memorandum responds to your note of March 29, 1991, in which you requested information about the staff's review of shutdown operations and the differences between U.S. and foreign plant procedures and activities during refueling.

Because of numerous operating events that have occurred during plant shutdowns, the staff is reviewing in detail shutdown operations. Specifically, they are (1) reviewing operating events; (2) visiting plants to learn more about the planning and execution of outages; and (3) completing special analytical studies, which include probabilistic safety assessments, thermal hydraulic calculations, and assessment of rapid reactivity transients. The staff plans to brief the Commission on the progress of fir review and their preliminary findings during June. On the basis of conversations between Ashok Thadani and Jack Guttmann, we understand that this briefing will satisfy your request.

With respect to your specific interest concerning differences between U.S. and foreign activities during refueling, the Committee on Nuclear Regulatory Activities (CNRA), at its November 1990 meeting, initiated a review of the approaches used by a number of member countries from the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) to address questions of safety during shutdown operations. The NRC is coordinating this review of their various approaches and we are currently preparing a paper that compares and contrasts them. This paper will be discussed in the June 1991 CNRA meeting. Because the paper will focus on the safety practices for shutdown operations, it will not specifically address how some foreign plants are able to refuel and perform maintenance in 21 days. However, we will discuss this question with foreign representatives during the June meeting and will provide you with a copy of gur trip report.
