Withdrawal of Request for Approval
to Use Alternative to Requirements
of 10CFR50.55a, "Codes and Standards"

Gentlemen:

As described in letter dated March 13, 1992 (1CAN039204), Entergy Operations planned to repair, as a preventative measure, thirty-seven existing Babcock & Wilcox (B&W) explosively expanded steam generator tube plugs at Arkansas Nuclear One. Unit 1 (ANO-1) during the current refueling outage (1R10). The preferred repair method is to install a welded plug utilizing an automatic welding process. The welded plug and the process were analyzed and qualified to the 1989 Edition of the ASME Lude, Section III, Division 1 and Section XI. Based on this, Entergy Operations requested approval of this Edition of the Code for use with this process.

Subsequent to that submittal, Entergy Operations decided to defer this repair. The basis for the decision to not perform the repair is that the particular B&W explosively expanded plug in question at ANO-1 (MK-3's and MK-4's) is different in design than those B&W plugs (MK-1's and MK-2's) used at other facilities where eddy current testing has revealed indications in the plugs. Because of the different design, smaller explosive charges were used at ANO-1, therefore producing lower residual stress in the plug.

Therefore, Entergy Operations is withdrawing the request for approval of the 1989 Edition of the Code for use with the automatic welding process. The withdrawal of this request has been discussed with the ANO NRR Project Manager.
