SUBJECT: NOTICE OF VIOLATION (NRC INSPECTION REPORT NOS. 50-498/92-07; 50-499/92-07)

This refers to the NRC special followup inspection team led by Dr. Dale A. Powers of this office during March 9-13, March 23-27, and April 14, 1992. The inspection included a review of activities authorized for your South Texas Project Electric Generating Station. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. In particular, the team gathered specific and programmatic information to enable NRC to address issues identified in a 10 CFR Part 2.206 Petition, dated February 10, 1992, and in other related information given to the news media (i.e., draft press release and draft notices of violation). The specific areas inspected included the general employee training and specific training for maintenance employees and for contract security employees; maintenance work controls and maintenance work package backlog; security controls for escorting visitors; internal radiation exposure assessment of exiting employees; handling of employee concerns; and corrective actions taken as a result of licensee review of issues provided in the petition. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examination of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress.

As discussed in the enclosed report, the team substantiated a number of concerns expressed by the petitioner, however, most did not have direct bearing on plant safety or regulatory requirements. Many of the petitioner's concerns related to historical problems that have continued in the implementation of the maintenance program and, in particular, during the instrumentation and control activities. Some of these historical problems were previously documented in the Maintenance/Surveillance functional section

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of the July 31, 1991, Systematic Assessment of Licensee Performance Report (NRC Inspection Report 50-498/91-99; 50-499/91-99).

We believe that there are several issues that should be discussed in a management meeting with your staff. The potential benefit of this meeting was discussed with you in the NRC exit meeting. Management meeting topics should include the safety implications arising from an increased backlog of plant maintenance needs and the management controls that ensure that safety-related needs are promptly recognized and assigned appropriate priority. Another issue that we wish to discuss is the lack of procedural adherence that was exhibited by some maintenance workers during the performance of nonsafetyrelated activities. We are concerned since the same administrative controls on procedural compliance are in place for all maintenance activities whether or not they are related to safety. We will contact you by separate correspondence to arrange the details for this meeting.

Based on the results of this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in violation of NRC requirements as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The violations are of concern because they indicate the presence of a lax attitude that has been exhibited by certain workers at the facility toward ensuring compliance with visitor escort procedures. We also are concerned with the lack of timely immediate corrective actions taken in response to the notification of the apparent violations by the petitioner, information given to the news media and subsequently provided to your staff, and the NRC team findings. Your response to the Notice should specifically address each of these concerns.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specified actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. After reviewing your response to this Notice, including your proposed corrective actions and the results of future inspections, the NRC will determine whether further NRC enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with NRC regulatory requirements.

In accordance with 10 CFR Part 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosures will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room.

The responses directed by this letter and the enclosed Notice are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, Pub. L. No. 96.511. Houston Lighting & Power Company -3-
