Enclosed is the Commonwealth Ed son Company (CECo) response to the Notice of Violation (NOV) which was transmitted with the reference letter and Inspection Report. CECo has reviewed the proposed violation and believes that the facts do not support a violation of 10 CFR 26.24(a)(3). CECo's review of the event indicates that a determination of Fitness For Duty was made in accordance with both CECo and the contractor firm's policies and training, which fully meets the intent of 10 CFR 26.24(a)(3). For these reasons, CECo respectfully requests the NRC to reconsider the violation.

Based on discussions between CECo and NRC Region III technical personnel subsequent to the inspection, it is CECo's understanding that the NRC technical staff's view is that For Cause Testing is required based solely on the detection of the odor of alcohol. A brief review of industry practice, relative to For Cause Testing based on the detection of the odor of alcohol, shows that Fitness For Duty Program requirements differ. Given this, CECo requests that this issue be addressed in a technical forum.
