No deficiencies were identified. However, nine areas Requiring Corrective Action (ARCAs) were identified. These ARCAs involved the failure to coordinate at the Forward Emergency Operations Center both an EBS message and the Alert and Notification System, failure to issue permanent dosimetry records to field radiological monitoring team members, training for EBS station personnel, training for key staff personnel on rumor control procedures, training for the county PIO on the EBS process, basic radiological training for bus drivers and law enforcement personnel, training for monitoring personnel on contamination limits, and planning and procedures for schools and special needs persons. We encourage you to assist the appropriate organizations in resolving the corrective actions and improvement items identified by FEMA. Resolution of these items should be completed prior to the next full-scale emergency preparedness exercise. We also encourage you to work closely with the State and counties in the development of a scenario for the next full-scale exercise that will effectively test the areas in which the above items were disclosed.

Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.
