NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Virginia Electric and Power

During an NRC inspection conducted on April 19 - May 16, 1992, a violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix A (1991), the violation is listed below:

Technical Specification Table 6.2-1 requires that procedures will be established to insure that NRC policy statement guidelines regarding working hours established for employees are followed.

Generic Letter 82-12, Nuclear Power Plant Staff Working Hours, establishes NRC policy statement guidelines on overtime limits, one of which is 72 hours in any seven day period and that deviation from the guidelines may be authorized under very unusual circumstances.

Contrary to the above, VPAP-0103, Working Hours and Limitations, failed to adequately insure that the NRC policy statement guidelines were followed in that personnel routinely, and on a widespread basis, exceeded 72 hours in seven day periods for conducting outage activities and maintaining emergency plan standby coverage.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement I).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Virginia Electric and Power Company is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, D.C. 20555 with a copy to the Regional Administrator, Region II, a copy to the NRC Resident Inspector at the facility that is the subject of this Notice, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice of Violation (Notice). This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include for each violation: (1) the reason for the violation, or, if contested, the basis for disputing the violation, (2) the corrective steps that have been taken and the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps that will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order or demand for

information may be issued as to why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked, or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time.
