Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress. The enclosed Inspection Report identifies activities that violated NRC requirements that will not be subject to enforcement action because the licensee's efforts in identifying and/or correcting the violation meet the criteria specified in Section VII.B. of the Enforcement Policy. We are concerned about the adequacy of your emergency response program for non-radioactive toxic materials. Consequently, certain details from this inspection were provided to the North Carolina Department of Labor, Bureau of Compliance for review and disposition.
