REPLY TO NOTICE OF DEVIATION

Gentlemen:

This will acknowledge the concern addressed in NRC memorandum NRC-92-0323 regarding NRC assessment of the May 27, 1992 response to Notice of Deviation as delineated in Report Nos. 50-325/92-04 and 50-324/92-04. Carolina Power and Light Company believes the May 27, 1992 response to the subject Notice of Deviation addressed the significant issues as cited; however, in an effort to ensure future commitments are maintained, the following actions are being taken:

- a. A review of the Facility Automated Commitment Tracking System (FACTS) is being conducted to determine if commitments identified as being "regulatory required" have exceeded their committed over due date. This review is expected to be completed by July 15, 1992.
- b. NRC docketed correspondence for the past three years is being reviewed to identify commitments, ensure the commitments are captured on FACTS, and that they are identified as being regulatory based. This review encompasses approximately 2700 documents and will require an estimated 4000 man-hours.

The results of the aforementioned NRC docketed correspondence review will be used to determine the need for an effectiveness review of the existing regulatory related commitment tracking system. This review, if required, will be used to identify deficiencies and to develop a corrective action plan.
