Subject: SHUTDOWN IN EXCESS OF 48 HOURS

The reactor will be shut down for about 3 days for repairs to the Standby Liquid Control System (SLCS).

On December 24, 1984, the reactor was started up following a one year extended outage for piping replacement. On January 1, 1985, during routine surveillance testing, the SLCS was found to be inoperable due to debris (rubber gloves) in the piping and the resulting blockage of relief valves. The reactor was shut down at 11:07 p.m. on January 1. The licensee plans to clean the SLCS piping and the 4,000 gallon storage tank to ensure no debris remains in the system.
