NOTICE OF VIOLATION

New York Power Authority
Indian Point Unit 3 Nuclear Power Plant

As a result of the inspection conducted on June 7-11, 1992, and in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy, (10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C), the following violation was identified.

The NRC-approved Indian Point 3 Nuclear Power Plant Guard Training and Qualification Plan, dated August 2, 1982, Revision 3, Section 1.4, states, in part, that any security personnel whose uncorrected distance vision is 20/40 or less in the better eye will be required to carry an extra pair of eye glasses while on duty.

Contrary to the above, on June 10, 1992, the inspector determined, through observations and interviews with security officers, that several officers whose uncorrected distance vision was 20/40 or less in the better eye, did not carry an extra pair of eye glasses while on duty.

This is a Severity Level IV Violation (Supplement III).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, New York Power Authority is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, D.C. 20555 with a copy to the NRC Resident Inspector, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice of Violation (Notice). This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include for each violation: (1) the reason for the violation, or, if contested, the basis for disputing the violation, (2) the corrective steps that have been taken and the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps that will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order may be issued to show cause why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked, or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time.

Any Safeguards Information (SGI), as defined in 10 CFR 73.21, contained in your submittal should be included in an enclosure so that the transmittal letter without the SGI can be placed in the NRC'S Public Document Room in accordance with 10 CFR 2.790(a).

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
