NUREG-0525, Safeguards Summary Event List (SSEL) is comprised of two parts. Vol. 1 summarizes events that occurred and were reported from pre-NRC through December 31, 1989. Vol. 2 summarizes events that occurred January 1, 1990 through December 31, 1991. Events are reported in a new format to facilitate usage of the data. These two volumes replace all previous issues of NUREG-0525.

Events which involve only source material, byproduct material, or natural uranium which are not safeguarded under NRC regulations are not included, except for a few events included in the Miscellaneous category because of public interest. Information on events involving nonsafeguarded material is available in NUREG-1272 published annually by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

Events which involve alcohol and drugs, formerly reported in Category IX, have been dropped from the Safeguards Summary Event List. Information on drug and alcohol events is contained in NUREG/CR-5758, Fitness for Duty in the Nuclear Power Industry, Annual Summary of Program Performance Reports, published annually by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

#### ABSTRACT

The Safeguards Summary Event List (SSEL), Vol. 1, provides brief summaries of several hundred safeguards-related events involving nuclear material or facilities regulated by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) which occurred and were reported from pre-NRC through December 31, 1989. Because of public interest, the Miscellaneous category includes a few events which involve either source material, byproduct material, or natural uranium which are exempt from safeguards requirements. Events are described under the categories of bomb-related, intrusion, missing and/or allegedly stolen, transportation, tampering/vandalism, arson, firearms, radiological sabotage, nonradiological sabotage, and miscellaneous. The information contained in the event descriptions is derived primarily from official NRC reporting channels.

#### INTRODUCTION

The Safeguards Summary Event List (SSEL) provides brief summaries of several hundred safeguards-related events involving nuclear materials or facilities regulated by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). The SSEL is comprised of two parts. Vol. 1 summarizes events that occurred and were reported from pre-NRC through December 31, 1989. Vol. 2 summarizes events that occurred January 1, 1990 through December 31, 1991. Because of public interest, the Miscellaneous category includes a few events which involve either byproduct material, source material, or natural uranium which are exempt from safeguards requirements. As the list is intended to provide a broad perspective on the nature of safeguards incidents in the licensed nuclear industry, both unusual and routine events are described. Events have been placed in the several categories described below. Each listing is included in a single category unless it is transportation-related, in which case it is cross-referenced in the Transportation section.

The first category, Bomb-Related Events, is concerned with explosives or incendiary devices and related threats. This category has been divided into two sections. Section A contains those events in which a bomb or explosive material was located or an explosion occurred at a licensed facility. Section B contains a chronology of all o'er bomb-related (e.g., hoax bomb threat) events. Intrusion Events (the second category) includes incidents of attempted or actual penetration of a facility's barriers or safeguards systems. The Missing or Allegedly Stolen section (the third category) includes events in which safeguarded material was stolen, alleged to be stolen, discovered missing, or found. Category IV, Transportation-Related Events, typically includes incidents where safeguarded material was misrouted or involved in an accident. Material reported missing or stolen during transport, for example, would be included in Category III and cross-referenced in the transportation category. Tampering/Vandalism (the fifth category) includes destruction or attempted destruction of property, parts an' equipment which do not directly cause a radioactive release. Category , Arson, includes intentional acts involving incendiary materials resulting in damage to property, equipment or other assets. The seventh category, Firearms-Related Events, typically describes the discharge, discovery, or loss of firearms at a licensed facility. Radiological Sabotage, Category VIIIA, includes any deliberate act directed against a safeguarded activity which could endanger the public health and safety by exposure to radiation. Nonradiological Sabotage, Category VIIIB, includes events characterized by the FBI as sabotage but which could not endanger the public health and safety by exposure to radiation. Al ahol and Drug-related events, Category IX, have been dropped from this document and are now contained in NUREG/CR-5758. Finally, Miscellaneous Events, Category X, are those which hold some interest to safeguards and the public but which do not fit into any of the previously described categories.

Each event listed in the body of the report is identified by an alphanumeric code composed of the appropriate category roman numeral, the last two digits of the year in which the event occurred, and a sequential number for that specific year and category. Each incident listing includes the appropriate date and location and a brief description of the event. Descriptions vary in detail according to the amount of data available through NRC reporting channels.

The size of this estimated inventory difference, coupled with allegations of possible diversion and technical uncertainties, resulted in intensive but inconclusive investigations by other Federal agencies. The situation was further complicated because: (1) the physical protection and material control programs at NUMEC during the

protection and material control programs at NUMEC during the mid-1960's were inadequate to prevent the theft of a significant quantity of special nuclear material (SNM); and (2) the material

accountability program at NUMEC during the mid-1960's was inadequate to detect a thift of a significant quantity of SNM. Therefore, the safeguards at NUMEC during the mid-1960's were such

that a covert theft of material could have been successful.

However, the nuclear material accountability practices at NUMEC

then were also poor enough that an inventory difference of this magnitude could have occurred without theft or diversion. Intensive investigations of the situation by Federal law enforcement agencies have found no information about material which seemed to be missing from this facility at this time.

Status:

Decommissioning/decontamination activities, including removal of processing equipment, at B&W-Apollo (formerly NUMEC) began after plant shutdown in 1983. [High enriched uranium (HEU) operations were discontinued in 1978, and low enriched uranium operations were discontinued in 1983.] For the period from startup in 1957 to June 30, 1985, the cumulative HEU inventory difference (ID) was 342 kg U-235. Based on current available information, the cumulative HEU ID (from 1957 to date) is estimated to be 361 kg U-235. The 19 kg ID increase is due to the difference between the selective destructive and non-destructive assay measurements taken with the floor in place compared to more refined measurements of the floor after dismantlement during decommissioning activities.

During a safeguards inspection in Switzerland, several fuel elements removed from NOK Unit 1 showed areas where the pin tubing was collapsed, indicating apparently missing fuel pellets. The NOK fuel was fabricated by Westinghouse-Cheswick and was placed in the core of NOK-1 in June 1969. The reactor was shut down in June 1971 for Core I unloading and subsequent fuel examination. Both Westinghouse and NOK officials reported that "several" pins were noted to have collapsed areas along the fuel area of the tubing, indicating areas of apparently

"missing" fuel pellets in the pins.

Resolution:

The elements with these collapsed areas were not "leakers," as determined from the shipping operation, and were reloaded into Core II of NOK-1. This indicated that any "missing pellets" were missing at the time of fabrication, rather than missing as

a result of erosion through a leak during operation.

A Tri-State truck driver informed the North Carolina Highway Patrol at 10:53 p.m. that he believed his vehicle, carrying uranium hexaflucride (low enriched) cylinders, was fired upon at 10:30 p.m. near a truck stop about 30 miles from the General Electric Commercial Fuel Fabrication plant in Wilmington, North Carolina.

Action:

A State Bureau of Investigation unit was dispatched to interview the driver, and General Electric placed the truck and cargo in isolation upon its arrival at Wilmington.

Resolution:

A visual check of the cylinders showed three deep dents in the stainless steel outer skin of one cylinder overpack. No evidence of penetration to the uranium hexafluoride cylinders was detected, and no radiological safety problems existed. It was not confirmed that the truck was actually fired on. In addition, it was possible that the incident was related to the nation's independent truckers' strike, which was taking place at this time


## REACTOR SAFEGUARDS EVENTS (1114) 1976 - 1989





SG EVENTS (580) EXCLUDING BOMB-RELATED EVENTS 1976 - 1989


