SUBJECT: ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR CONSIDERATION IN REVIEW OF EMERGENCY PLANS FOR ENRICO FERMI ATOMIC POWER PLANT, UNIT 2

- Letter to H. R. Denton, Director, Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, from Joan Mumaw, IHM and and Michael Barrett dated February 10, 1983 enclosing "Citizens Concerns Regarding the Proposed Radiological Emergency Response", a document presented to the Monroe County Board of Commissioners in August 1982.

By memorandum dated March 3, 1983 FEMA was formally requested to provide support to the NRC in responding to emergency preparedness issues raised in a petition by Monroe County, Michigan during the ongoing licensing proceedings for the Fermi-2 plant. The issues are being treated under 10 CFR 2.206 of the Commission's regulations. At the time the Monroe County issues were accepted for consideration under 2.206, members of the public were informed that if they so wished, additional information to supplement the original petition could be submitted for staff consideration. Subsequently, two additional documents (references 1 and 2) were received. The purpose of this memorandum is to request further FEMA assistance, in reviewing the two additional submittals:

References 1 and 2 were previously furnished to FEMA by letters dated April 25, 1983 and May 23, 1983, respectively, for consideration during the FEMA review of the emergency preparedness issues raised by Monroe County. Our preliminary review of the documents indicates that the material submitted encompasses a broader range of subjects than those raised by Monroe County. Therefore, to the extent any issues raised go beyond the scope of those raised by Monroe County in their original petition, we request that they be considered by FEMA in your overall assessment of the State and local emergency plans for the Fermi-2 facility.

We believe that any FEMA review of offsite emergency preparedness (for Fermi-2, which is based on the planning standards of NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1, encompass all the areas of concern and therefore, it is not necessary to provide a specific response to each issuer However, to assist us in the licensing process, we request that an indication that the documents have been considered in your review process be included in your future Interim Finding report. Please contact us if you desire any additional information.
