

SUBJECT: FEMA SUPPORT FOR NRC LICENSING OF SHOREHAM NUCLEAR STATION

In response to an NRC request of June 17, 1983, FEMA provided findings in a June 23, 1983 memorandum on the Long Island Lighting Company (LILCO) Transition Plan for the Shoreham Nuclear Power Station. Primarily because of the limited time available for the FEMA review of the Transition Plan to meet the then-established licensing schedule, the initial review was performed with the assistance of a contractor, rather than through the customary procedure involving the Regional Assistance Committee (RAC).

In a letter to William J. Dircks, Executive Director for Operations, NRC, from Jeffrey S. Bragg, Executive Deputy Director, FEMA, dated August 29, 1983, FEMA expressed a desire to utilize the services of the RAC to review the LILCO Transition Plan if adequate time was available. As I discussed with you, there has been a delay in the Shoreham licensing proceedings due to an issue unrelated to emergency planning. I understand that FEMA can complete the review, including Revision 1 responses to the inadequacies identified by the earlier FEMA evaluation, utilizing the services of the RAC by December 1, 1983.

Accordingly, this letter formalizes the NRC request for FEMA review of the LILCO Transition Plan including Revision 1 with findings and determinations to be transmitted to the NRC not later than December 1, 1983.
