RISC Minutes and Information Regarding Next Meeting

Attached are the minutes from the meeting held on August 20, 1992. I regret that we didn't have more State participation, but I still felt the meeting was very productive.

Also attached is an updated Notification Roster and the revised Work Plan. Both have been revised to reflect changes ip ESF #2, Communications.

As decided at our last meeting, I will try to schedule the next RISC Meeting in Boise, Idaho, so that we have the opportunity to meet our Idaho State counterparts and begin coordination. At the same time, we are hoping to visit the Boise Interagency Fire Center to get a better handle on what resources they have available. The meeting will be held in November and should last three days. As soon as the date has been set, I will let you know.

A representative from each ESF should be prepared to brief the State on their portion of the Federal Response Plan. The Headquarters Annex Planners have been working on formal presentations to be used for this purpose. I have requested a copy of all presentations from the contractor who is doing the final product. However, you may already have a briefing prepared that you would rather use. Either is fine with me. Just let me know if you need the copy that I will be receiving.

It is important that all ESF's be represented at this meeting. When your Headquarters Annex Planners were tasked with developing these presentations, they indicated that regional ESF representatives should deliver the material, instead of FEMA staff. Please let me know as soon as possible if there is a problem having an ESF representative at this meeting.

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Puget Sound Interagency Steering Committee Meeting

August 20, 1992

Camp Murray, Washington

The RISC meeting began at 9:00 a.m. with approximately 25 participants attending. The main purpose of the meeting was to enable Federal ESF Leaders to meet with their State counterparts to discuss actions taken after Response 91B. Since there were only three State representatives attending, this coordination was not accomplished and the meeting was completed within one day.

Update Since Response 918

Joel Aggergaard, from the WA State Division of Emergency Management, briefed the group on what the State has been doing since Response 91B. Improvements include additional communications capabilities being added. developing a Survivable Unisis Management concept paper; changing their sheltering strategy to be more realistic and utilizing the Red Cross shelters; updating their resource listings, etc.

Individual ESF Updates

ESF Leaders were asked to provide updates of what they had been working on. All ESF's were represented except ESF #4, Firefighting, and ESF #12, Energy.

ESF #1, Transportation

- Several National meetings and workshops are being held around the country focusing on ESF #1 responsibilities under the FRP.
- The draft ESF #1 Annex is currently being reviewed and will be out for comments within the next two weeks.

ESF #2. Communications

- The ESF Leader has recently retired and no one else has been designated as Lead.

ESF #3. Public Works

 Several National workshops are being conducted to educate COE staff and other agency personnel on ESF #3 responsibilities under the FRP.

ESF #4. Firefighting (Not represented)

ESF #5. Information & Planning

Currently working on the Information & Planning section of the Regional Response Plan.

ESF #6, Mass Care

Red Cross is completing their reorganization. A full-time representative has been assigned to the Bothell FRC. She will be working more with the State and Federal agencies instead of the local agencies.

ESF #7, Resources

- Currently in the process of identifying resources for use in emergencies.
- She mentioned that regulations have recently changed that allow the Red Cross to use GSA services in disaster situations.

ESF #8, Health & Medical

- A National task force has been convened to develop their unnex. The draft should be available by late September.
- Regions are being given communications equipment in support of the FRP.
- ESF #8 has been partially activated several times during the past year which has been good training.
- ESF #8 is extensively involved in both the NDMS and the FFE-3 exercises coming up.

ESF #9. Urban Search & Rescue

 FEMA and DOD are involved in training all the task forces to perform their responsibilities.

ESF #10, Hazardous Materials

- National has recently developed an annex for all Regions that places the emphasis on the National Contingency Plan and using the RRT in conjunction with the FRP.
- EPA is currently working on their backup Region concept.

ESF #11, Food

- Currently working on their annex.

ESF #12, Energy (Not represented)

Status of ESF #2 Communications

Denny Jenkins, FEMA, MERS Unit, briefed on some of the actions that FEMA is taking to ensure communications will be available between the ROC and the State EOC. He indicated that he will continue to move forward with the communications planning until a new ESF Leader is designated. He will try to determine what agencies have, who the ESF staff will need to talk to, etc. and begin developing a comprehensive communications plan.

Revised ESF #5 Briefing

Greg Polt, ESF #5 Leader, distributed the newly revised ESF #5 Annex and briefed on what the differences were from the previous annex.

New Initiatives During Shaker III

Tammy Doherty briefed the group on some of the different ideas tried during Shaker III. These included a slightly different ERT structure and use of staff from other agencies until FEMA arrived. She also shared a copy of the After-Action Report with the group.

Information Items

The following information items were shared and discussed:

- <u>Status of FRP</u> - The Director signed the forward to the FRP on August 14 and the FRP is being printed. Distribution should be within the next month.

- <u>Idaho Orientation</u> - Tammy Doherty made a presentation to the Bureau of Disaster Services staff in Idaho on August 10. This was an initial orientation to acquaint BDS staff with the FRP.

- <u>RISC Name Change</u> - It was recommended that the name of the RISC group be changed to incorporate the States of Oregon and Idaho. It was agreed the name would be "Northwest Regional Interagency Steering Committee."

- Financial Management Annex - Copies of the new Financial Management Annex were distributed. Tammy in ated she would be attending a meeting concerning this Ar on September 24 and asked that any questions or comments about the Annex be forwarded to her prior to that date.

Workplan Items

- Tammy Doherty distributed updated Notification Rosters and asked that she be advised of any changes as soon as possible. She reminded ESF Leaders to ensure their Notification Rosters for their Support Agency staff were also up-to-date.

- Tammy indicated that Notification and Deployment procedures were being drafted for inclusion in the Regional Response Plan. Once completed, they will be distributed for comments.

Agreement was reached on finalizing the workplan.

Other Items

- There was discussion about how to keep the group informed of upcoming training and exercise events being held by the different agencies. Tammy will try to develop a calendar that can be distributed periodically to all RISC members.

- Based on the lack of State participation in the RISC Meeting, Tammy recommended that ESF Leaders make contact with their State counterparts on an individual basis and not rely on the RISC Meetings for that interaction.

- It was recommended and agreed that the next RISC Meeting be held in Boise, Idaho, in November. By then, the State counterparts will have been identified and the RISC group can provide training to the State about the FRP. This will allow ESF Leaders to meet their counterparts and begin the coordination process. Tammy will also try to schedule a tour of the Boise Interagency Fire Center so the group can become familiar with BIFC's resources.

The meeting adjourned at 3:00 p.m.

1. Use the 24-hour number given (unless it is for a cellular phone).

2. If there is no 24-hour number given, use the ESF Leader's home telephone number.

3. If the ESF Leader doesn't answer, use the Alternate's home telephone number.

NOTE: THE INDIVIDUALS WHOSE HOME TELEPHONE NUMBERS APPEAR IN THIS ROSTER HAVE GRANTED AUTHORIZATION FOR THE INCLUSION OF THEIF HOME TELEPHONE NUMBER. THESE HOME PHONE NUMBERS ARE PROTECTED BY THE PRIVACY ACT, AND ARE TO BE USED FOR OFFICIAL PURPOSES ONLY. ANY OTHER USE OR DISSEMINATION OF THE HOME TELEPHONE NUMBERS IS PROHIBITED WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE INDIVIDUALS.
