The referenced SECY document described the results of the Systematic Evaluation Program (SEP) at Dresden Nuclear Power Station, Unit 2. As part of the "Implementation" section of the SECY document, the Staff noted that the licensee (Commonwealth Edison) stated their intent to implement all SEP modifications and procedure changes, where applicable, at Quad Cities Station, Units 1 and 2. The SECY document references a discussion with the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) on December 9, 1982. This decision is documented in Reference (b).

Commonwealth Edison (CECO) has reviewed the Dresden 2 SEP to determine the applicability of the 88 Dresden SEP items to Quad Cities Station, Units 1 and 2. This review has resulted in the identification of the applicable items, as well as associated recommendations. CECO is currently developing action plans to: 1) evaluate and prioritize the recommendations in light of current planned work; 2) implement appropriate recommendations; and 3) identify alternative recommendations. These action plans will be completed by August 31, 1993.
