SITE VISIT TO QUAD CITIES STATION FOR A RES CONTRACT: TRUCK BUMB THREAT ANALYSIS

The Safeguards Section, Office of Nuclear Regulatory Research, has undertaken a short term research contract at the request of the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards (Enclosure 1) to study the destructive and safety consequences of an explosive laden vehicle used as a weapon against a nuclear facility. RES has contracted with Sandia National Laboratories to perform this study. As a part of the study, Sandia will require site visits to a few selected facilities. The Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation has been asked to help-expedite the study (Enclosure 2) and has agreed to provide the necessary licensing interface (Enclosure 3). Since this study requires immediate action, arrangements have been made for a site visit to Quad Cities Station on February 7 and 8, 1984.

Your cooperation with this site visit is appreciated. A list of visitors is attached (Enclosure 4) for your information.

SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR INITIATION OF RES PROJECT FOR NMSS/SG

This office has identified a need for short-term, immediate action research to be undertaken in accordance with the attached statement of work. During initial coordination with the Ruman Factors and Safeguards Research Branch of the Division of Operations, RES indicated that 100k of existing SG funds can be reprogrammed for this effort. We believe that this level of funding is appropriate for the scope of the project. We request that each of the three required tasks be completed within 30 days of initiation with a draft final report delivered by April, 1984. It is recommended that Sandia or Los Alamos Laboratories be tasked with this project due to the availability of required technical expertise and past experience in this area.
