SUBJECT: FEMA SUPPLEMENTAL INTERIM FINDING ON OFFSITE
RADIOLOGICAL EMERGENCY PLANNING FOR FERMI-2

The enclosed memorandum from Richard W. Krimm, Assistant Associate Director, Office of Natural and Technological Hazards Programs, FEMA, dated May 14, 1984, forwards FEMA's Supplemental Interim Finding on Offsite Radiological Emergency Planning for Fermi-2 which was prepared by FEMA Region V.

The FEMA report addresses the review and evaluation of the Brownstown Township plan and the revised Monroe County plan including an evaluation of the impact of the revised Monroe County plan on the previously provided FEMA responses to the specific concerns raised in the Monroe County petition. FEMA concludes that based on the FEMA Region V review "there is reasonable assurance that the plans are adequate and capable of being implemented in the event of an accident at the site." The FEMA Region V report establishes that the revised Monroe County plan supports FEMA's previous responses to the emergency planning issues specified in the County petition.

The FEMA finding report does identify some remaining inadequacies in the offsite emergency plans relative to some of the planning criteria items in NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1, and notes that the State of Michigan has been requested to take corrective action.


