

SUBJECT: UCS SUPPLEMENTAL PETITION FOR SHOW CAUSE ORDER
CONCERNING TMI-1 EMERGENCY FEEDWATER SYSTEM

By the enclosed Petition dated May 9, 1984, the Union of Concerned Scientists (UCS) supplemented its January 20, 1984, Petition concerning the TMI-1 Emergency Feedwater System. The additional relief that UCS requests relates to the environmental qualification of the EFW system. Based on the results of an NRC audit of the Licensee's environmental qualification records, UCS requested that the Commission: 1) direct the staff to independently verify the existence and technical sufficiency of the Licensee's environmental qualification documentation for the EFW system; 2) direct OI to investigate whether the Licensee has made material false statements to the NRC in connection with the environmental qualification program; and 3) direct OIA to investigate whether the staff provided false or misleading information to the Boards or Commission, or has been "derelict in its duty" with respect to the environmental qualification program at TMI-1.

As with UCS' February 13, 1984 letter to the Commission, this supplement has been referred to the staff for treatment as part of the pending 2.206 Petition. In this regard, the first and second issues outlined above can be resolved by NRR and should be discussed in the final decision. By separate memorandum, I have referred UCS' supplemental Petition to OIA for action as it deems appropriate on the third issue raised by UCS.

I have also enclosed for your use a draft letter to Ellyn Weiss of UCS informing her that UCS' May 9, 1984, supplement has been referred to the staff for treatment as part of her Petition.
