UTILITY SYSTEMS NOT AFFILIATED WITH WPPSS NUCLEAR PROJECT NO. 3

Dear Mr. Braitman:

Attached for your information, please find five copies of the response to item 9 of the information requested by the Attorney General for Anti-Trust Review of Facility License Applications, as contained in Appendix L to 10 CFR part 50.

You will note that WPPSS Nuclear Project No. 3 is similar in nature to the Supply System's Nuclear Project No. 1 for which anti-trust information has been previously submitted. However, unlike the Nuclear Project No. 1, Project No. 3 is to be owned as tenants in common, seventy percent (70%) by the Washington Public Power Supply System and thirty percent (30%) by four investor-owned utilities as follows:

Pacific Power & Light Company 10%
Portland General Electric Company 10%
Puget Sound Power & Light Company 5%
The Washington Water Power Company 5%

The Supply System's seventy percent (70%) ownership share of the Project has one hundred and three participants of which thirty-one are municipalities, twenty-six are districts, and forty-six are cooperatives.

### Item 9, Appendix L 10 CFR 50

List non-affiliated electric utility systems with peak loads smaller than applicants which serve either as wholesale or at retail adjacent to areas served by applicant. Provide a geographic one line diagram of applicant's generating and transmission facilities (including subtransmission) indicating the location of adjacent systems and as to such systems indicate (if available) their load, their annual load growth, their generating capacity, their largest thermal generating unit size, and their minimum reserve criteria.

As stated in the cover letter, "Project No. 3 will be owned as tenants in common seventy percent (70%) by the Supply System and thirty percent (30%) by four investor-owned power utilities." The Supply System is comprised of 21 public-owned and consumer-owned agencies of the State of Washington. An ownership share of thirty percent (30%) of the Project was offered to and accepted by the investor owned utilities in the West Group Area. Percentage participation by these utilities is as stated in the cover letter.

The output of the Supply System's seventy percent (70%) ownership share of the Project was offered to 104 public and consumer-owned agencies in the Pacific Northwest who are statutory preference customers of Bonneville and is being purchased by 103 of those agencies through "Net Billing" agreements. One municipal system, Eugene Water and Electric Board, declined the offer of participation.

Following is a tabulation and location map of the utilities in the Pacific Northwest who are not participating in the Project.
