> SUBJECT: Arkansas Nuclear One - Units 1 & 2 Docket Nos. 50-313 and 50-368 License Nos. DPR-51 and NPF-6 Certification of Compliance to 10CFR50.49 Generic Letter C4-24

Gentlemen:

We have received and reviewed Generic Letter 84-24 (ØCNA128425) which requests Arkansas Power and Light to submit certifications regarding the status of our environmental qualification (EQ) program. The letter requests certification of three separate statements. Gur response to each is provided below.

a) AP&L hereby affirms that we have in place and are implementing an Environmental Qualification Program that will satisfy the requirements of 10CFR50.49 as interpreted by AP&L within the currently approved schedule for the plant without further extension. This statement is consistent with our most recent submittals made to the NRC in August, 1984 (1CANØ884Ø6 and 2CANØ884Ø2), in which we provided our schedules for compliance with 10CFR50.49.

- b) AP&L hereby affirms that ANO-1 and 2 have at least one path to safe shutdown using fully qualified equipment, or we have submitted a justification for continued safe operation (JCO) pending full qualification of any equipment not fully qualified. As you are aware, the "safe shutdown" design basis for ANO is hot shutdown.
- c) AP&L hereby affirms that all other equipment within the scope of 10CFR50.49 is either fully qualified or a JCO has been submitted pending full qualification. This affirmation does not apply to Regulatory Guide 1.97 equipment that was not listed in our August submittals. The schedule for qualification of such R.G. 1.97 equipment is not governed by 10CFR50.49(g), but rather is being established in the R.G. 1.97 resolution process which is part of the Nureg 0737 Supplement 1 program. This position is consistent with previous discussions with the NRC staff.

One additional point should be made concerning the I&E Bulletin and Information Notices listed in the Generic Letter. The I&E notices which pertain to EQ matters are reviewed and dispositioned in the same manner as all I&E notices. As a result of our review and assessment of all of the Bulletins and Notices listed in Generic Letter 84-24, we can affirm that all EQ equipment is still considered qualified.
