Dear Ms. Bell:

This is in response to your letter dated June 5, 1984, in which you requested, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, copies of documents regarding the testing, start-up, low-power and full power operation of the Washington Public Supply System No. 2 unit excluding formal Licensee Event Reports which have been filed with the NRC.

In an attempt to narrow the scope of your request a conference call was set up with Mrs. Pappas, of my staff, yourself and Mr. Dodds, Region V. In that conversation you agreed to limit the time frame on the request to the past six months. However, you did not otherwise limit the scope of your request. Upon further consideration, we believe that the request is unreasonably broad. We have been informed by the staff at Region V that it will take approximately 120 hours of professional search time. As specified in 10 CFR 9.14(b)(3) the charge for professional search is \$12.00 per hour. Therefore, the approximate total charge for search would be \$1,440.00. If you wa to pursue the fee waiver, you may include this request in your response to our letter to you on this subject dated July 13, 1984.

If you wish, you may submit a new request focussed more narrowly on particular issues, events or reports. In order to assist you in this regard, we are enclosing printouts of all the documents located in the Public Document Room from the first of the year that relate to the topic of this request. However, we cannot guarantee that these lists are complete.

This completes action on your request.
