SUBJECT: NOTICE OF VIOLATION AND NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 50-461/92016(DRP)

Dear Mr. Perry:

This refers to the inspection conducted by Messrs. P. G. Brochman, F. L. Brush, and E. R. Duncan of this office on July 28 through September 8, 1992. The inspection included a review of authorized activities for your Clinton Power Station facility. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selective examination of procedures and representative records, observations of activities in progress, and interviews with personnel.

Based on the results of this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in violation of NRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The violation is of concern because your maintenance staff failed to evaluate the impact of the failure of a balance-of-plant electrical relay on identical safety-related relays on the emergency diesel generators (DG) when the cause of the failure had clear generic implications. The poor questioning attitude exhibited by your maintenance staff and the initially erroneous analysis of the safety impact of the relay failure, including the poor understanding of the diesel generator protective trip system, and the impact on the ability of the DG to mitigate a design basis accident, are similar to concerns we expressed in our most recent SALP report.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. After reviewing your response to this Notice, including your proposed corrective actions and the results of future inspections, the NRC will determine whether further NRC enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with NRC regulatory requirements

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In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the Commission's regulations, a copy of this letter, the enclosures, and your response to this letter will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room.

The responses directed by this letter and the accompanying Notice are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the *Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980*, Pub. L. No. 96-511.

We will gladly discuss any questions you have concerning this inspection.
