Dear Mr. Felton:

This request is made under the federal Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. 552.

Please send me copies of all correspondence, memoranda, reports, studies and other documents that have been sent to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission from members of the Louisiana congressional delegation on the subject of Waterford 3, a nuclear power plant located at Taft, La., and owned by Louisiana Power & Light Co.

The Freedom of Information Act provides that if portions of a document are exempt from release, the remainder must be segregated and disclosed. Therefore, I will expect you to send me all nonexempt portions of the records which I have requested, and ask that you justify any deletions by reference to specific exemptions of the Freedom of Information Act. I reserve the right to appeal your decision to withhold any materials.

I promise to pay reasonable search and duplication fees in connection with this request. However, if you estimate that the total fees will exceed \$75, please notify me so that I may authorize expenditure of a greater amount.

I am a journalist employed by The Times-Picayune/The States-Item, the daily newspaper in New Orleans. I intend to use the information I am requesting as the basis for newspaper articles. Therefore, I ask that you waive all search and duplication fees.

As I am making this request in the capacity of a journalist and this information is of timely value, I will appreciate your com- municating with me by telephone, rather than by mail, if you have any questions regarding this request.

Thank you for your assistance, and I will look forward to receiving your reply within 10 days, as required by law.
