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NRC STAFF'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

I. INTRODUCTION

The Staff of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (Staff) respectfully moves the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board (Board) pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.711 of the Commission's regulations for an extension of time until February 27, 1985, to file responses to Applicants' motions for summary disposition of emergency planning contentions.

II. DISCUSSION

Pursuant to the schedule agreed upon by the parties and adopted by the Board, Applicants' last day for filing of motions for summary disposition of emergency planning contentions was January 14, 1985. The Staff's responses to those motions were due 25 days after service of the motions. Applicants' proposed schedule ff. Tr. 6840. Between January 10, and January 14, 1985, Applicants filed approximately 13 motions for summary disposition. The Staff's responses to these motions require a great deal of coordination of both the Staff's and FEMA's resources. Due to mechanical difficulties in this coordination, the Staff finds it

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
necessary to make this request for an extension of time. These difficulties arise from the fact that the people necessary to respond to these motions are located in Washington, D.C., Texas and Atlanta.

Staff Counsel has discussed this motion with the affected parties. The Staff has made it clear that responses will be filed as quickly as possible, but in no event later than February 27, 1985. For those responses filed before that date, Intervenors would have their usual 10 days to file their responses. For those responses filed on February 27, 1985, the Intervenors would have until March 11, 1985 to file their responses. All of the affected parties have agreed to the Staff's request as outlined above.

### III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons set forth above, the Staff respectfully moves the Board for an order extending the Staff's final date for responding to Applicants' motions for summary disposition until February 27, 1985.

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
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
