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Management Actions Taken

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Drug and alcohol testing results for the reporting period are described in Attachment 1.

The licensee employees testing positive for illegal drugs/alcohol were denied access to the Protected Area. Pursuant to Plant Administrative Procedure (PAP-0224) "Fitness For Duty" requirements, individuals and/or their company representative were informed of the right to appeal, and of the procedural requirements in order to re-establish unescorted access to the Protected Area. To date, one employee (tested positive for alcohol) initiated steps to restore unescorted access and subsequently was reinstated.

All contractor employees testing positive for illegal drugs/alcohol were denied access to the Protected Area. Pursuant to Plant Administrative Procedure (PAP-0224) "Fitness For Duty" requirements, individuals and/or their company representative were informed of the right to appeal, and of the procedural requirements in order to re-establish unescorted access to the Protected Area. To date, none of these individuals have initiated steps regarding this matter.

Three individuals were subjected to unannounced follow-up testing during this reporting period, as a result of a Fitness For Duty Program concerns.

Initiatives Taken

Perry management communicated the Fitness For Duty policy to plant personnel throughout this reporting period.
