I, JERRY ARTYIP, hereby make the following voluntary statement to Donald Driskill and Richard Frost who have identified themselves to me as Investigators with the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission. I make this statement freely with no threats or promises of reward having been made to me.

I am currently employed at the CPSES, Glen Rose, Texas as a protective coatings QC inspector for the Ebasco company. I have been employed in this position from September of 1982 to the present.

On August 24, 1983, I participated in a meeting that was conducted by Thomas Kelly and Jerry Firtel, both Principal Corrosion Engineers for Ebasco Service Incorporated. The purpose of this meeting was to inform the Q.C. inspectors of proposed changes in Q.C. procedures. At this meeting the Q.C. inspectors were allowed to ask questions.

I recall one Q.C. inspector named William Durham who asked several questions. I did not feel that Durham was disruptive. His questions were not out of the ordinary. His questions concerned the "nickel test" and other technical
