

Statement of

Edwin S. Dean dated May 10, 1983.

About two to two and a half years ago, there was an incident in which one of my foremen, Robert Mossery, brought to my attention that a hanger that was ~~not~~ being redesigned had evidence of a torch having been used to enlarged the predrilled holes. Procedure prohibits the enlargement of holes in tube steel using a cutting torch. I instructed that this hanger be scrapped. I attempted to find out who had used the torch on this hanger, but I never did find out. I put out word that such a violation of procedure could lead to termination of an employee if such a violation was discovered.

Normally alterations of predrilled holes in tube steel are accomplished by off-setting the holes and using a beveled washer ~~to~~ to bring the piece flush with the mating surface. To my knowledge, this was an isolated instance of a torch used to enlarge holes. I do not recall any other instances of this violation.
