

Statement of

Raymond H. Hebert

My name is Raymond Hebert, and I have been an employee of Brown & Root for sixteen years and five months. In 1979 I was transferred from another Brown & Root job to Comanche Peak as a hanger superintendent.

During the time I have been employed as a superintendent at Comanche Peak I do not know of any instances where Brown & Root employees have made cuts or enlarged drilled holes on tube steel with a torch. A torch can be used on base plates, but not tube steel. Also I have never instructed craft employees to use a torch on tube steel.

I do not ever recall being told of a Brown & Root employee welding lugs on stainless steel pipes without purging the line, unless they had prior approval from the welding engineers in the form of a purge deletion. I have never instructed or attempted a cause a craft employee to weld lugs on pipes without purging the lines without a purge deletion. I have told crew members to attempt to get purge deletions from the engineers because of unusual difficulties in purging the pipes, but I have never caused it to happen without I have read the foregoing statement consisting of 1 handwritten engineering ~~typed~~ pages.
