Gentlemen:

This refers to the routine safety inspection conducted by Messrs. S. G. DuPont and D. E. Hills of this office on December 10, 1984, through January 11, 1985, of activities at Fermi 2 authorized by NRC Construction Permit CPPR-87 and to the discussion of our findings with Messrs. R. S. Lenart and G. R. Overbeck and others of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The enclosed copy of our inspection report identifies areas examined during the inspection. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selective examination of procedures and representative records, observations, and interviews with personnel.

During this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in non-compliance with NRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Appendix. A written response is required. Because of the failure of a significant number of your QA staff to perform an adequate inspection of activities relating to a specific design modification, you are requested to provide in your response a description of your corrective actions to ensure the correct implementation of all QA Level 1 design modifications currently being performed.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790(a), a copy of this letter and the enclosure(s) will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room unless you notify this office, by telephone, within ten days of the date of this letter and submit written application to withhold information contained therein within thirty days of the date of this letter. Such application must be consistent with the requirements of 2.790(b)(1). If we do not hear from you in this regard within the specified periods noted above, a copy of this letter, the enclosure(s), and your response to this letter will be placed in the Public Document Room.

The responses directed by this letter (and the accompanying Notice) are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, PL 96-511.

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We will gladly discuss any questions you have concerning this inspection.

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
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
