Re: Donald C. Cook Nuclear Plant NPDES Permit No. MI 0005827 Steam Generator Blowdown

Dear Mr. Zugger:

With both nuclear units out of service, the plant heating boiler was started on January 11, 1985. A blowdown sample taken at 1130 hours on January 11, 1985 was analyzed and found to have an iron concentration of 1.21 PPM. The iron concentration is most likely the result of infrequent use of the boiler.

An NPDES modification which exempts the plant heating boilers from iron and copper limits was approved by the Michigan Water Resources Commission on March 21, 1979, although the permit was never formally modified to reflect the administrative action.
