- 7. () Items of noncompliance were not supported by facts.
- 8. (x) A QA breakdown was (was not) established for the following reasons: Most of the items of noncompliance appear to be procedural and not substantive in nature. For example, some of the procedures were not properly reviewed and approved but there is no indication that the procedures were deficient or contributed to an incluent with health and safety considerations.
