Received call from John Russo, State of New Jersey.

apparently a shipment of ~~spent~~<sup>spent</sup> fuel from Oyster Creek was sent out either Monday or Tuesday

The vehicle blew a tire on Rt 166 (Dover Township) enroute to Rt. 287. The truck was turned  
to a motel. Many students were apparently alarmed.

Russo received a call yesterday (10-1-75) from a democratic candidate from the 16th  
District (N.J.) - Peter Dowling. Dowling apparently received a call from the Mayor of one of  
the municipalities en route telling that he (mayor) was approached by a PIRG Group at  
Salem Hall who ~~told~~ asked him w/ "what would happen if some radicals decided to sacrifice  
his life and blowing the trailer in your town"? The mayor was quite upset. - called Dowling  
Russo had to identify the mayor but couldn't. Russo talked to Dowling and calmed him  
down. Dowling was going to call the mayor. If the mayor calmed down it would be dropped  
If not (the Mayor was preparing an ordinance banning the shipments through his town), Dowling  
would let Russo know his name.

Russ said that a representative of EPA had talked to three P.R.C. people who stated "We will do anything to stop nuclear power"? Russ was worried as to what "anything" might be.

Russ was also annoyed that we didn't let him know about the next fuel shipment as we had in the past. He has notified State Police so that higher visibility / surveillance can be maintained. There may be concern with an individual in P.R.C. other than P.R.C. itself. P.R.C. (N.J.) may be more militant than others since they have been around longer.
