License Conditions 2.C. (14)a and 2.C. (12)a

San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 2 and 3

This submittal provides written confirmation of our prompt notification of February 5, 1985, pursuant to License Condition 2.6 to Facility Operating Licenses NPF-10 and NPF-15 for San Onofre Units 2 and 3, respectively, of reportable occurrences associated with the fire protection program.

License Conditions 2.C. (14)a and 2.C. (12)a of Operating Licenses NPF-10 and NPF-15, respectively, require that SCE maintain in effect and fully implement the Fire Protection Plan as delineated in the Fire Hazards Analysis (FHA).

During the current Unit 2 refueling outage, the routine 18-month surveillances of over 2,000 fire rated assemblies and other fire protection systems have been conducted. Approximately 8% of these surveillances identified deficiencies including missing or damaged penetration seals, seal shrinkage, and damaged cable wraps. In accordance with Technical Specification 3.7.9, a compensatory fire watch was established within one hour of discovery of each discrepancy during the surveillance. In addition, Nonconformance Reports (NCR's), documenting these deficiencies, have been issued.

Our surveillance of fire rated assemblies is continuing and appropriate corrective action is being taken or is being evaluated and will be implemented as part of the dispositioning of all NCR's. The cause and corrective actions implemented will be reported in the Licensee Event Report and 14-Day Follow-Up Report by February 19, 1985.
