
JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY - OYSTER CREEK, UNIT 1

I received a call from Mr. Finrock, Vice President for Operations, JCP&L, on Wednesday, January 9, 1974. Mr. Finrock said he was just leaving to go to Court to answer a Writ of Injunction from the State of New Jersey regarding the State's attempt to prevent them from shutting down the Nuclear Power Plant. This subject is covered in other correspondence; however, it does relate to the possibility of a significant "fish kill" of menhaddenfish if the plant shuts down and in effect causes the water in Oyster Creek to cool down to approximately 37° - a temperature that insures 100% mortality of menhadden fish. Mr. Finrock said they were coming down for safety reasons and also to conduct some plant repairs and modifications to permit operations at 30 MW electric higher than their ^{current} ~~maximum~~ output.

Mr. Finrock said that he would call me after his "day in court".
