Gentlemen:

This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. Hubacek of this office on January 7-9, 1976, of activities authorized by NRC Construction Permit No. CPPR-103 for the Materford Steam Electric Station, Unit 3 facility, and to the discussion of our findings held by the inspector with Mr. Henderson and other members of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

Areas examined during the inspection and our findings are discussed in the enclosed inspection report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examination procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector.

During the inspection it was found that certain activities under your license appear to be in noncompliance with Appendix B to 10 CFR 50 of the NRC Regulations, "Quality Assurance Criteria for Nuclear Power Plants." The items of noncompliance and references to the partiment requirements are identified in Section I of the summary of the enclosed report.

We have also examined actions you have taken with regard to previously identified enforcement matters and unresolved items. The status of these items is identified in Sections II and IV of the summary of the enclosed report.

This notice is sent to you pursuant to the provisions of Section 2.201 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations. Section 2.201 requires you to submit to this office, within 30 days of your receipt of this notice, a written statement or explanation in reply including: (1) corrective steps which have been taken by you, and the results achieved; (2) corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further noncompliance; and (3) the date when full compliance will be achieved. You are not required to submit written statements or explanations for items of noncompliance identified by the licensee.

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In accordance with Section 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, a copy of this letter and the enclosed inspection report will be placed in the NRC's Public Document Room. If this report contains any information that you believe to be proprietary, it is necessary that you submit a written application to this office, within 20 days of the date of this letter, requesting that such information be withheld from public disclosure. The application must include a full statement of the reasons why it is claimed that the information is proprietary. The application should be prepared so that any proprietary information identified is contained in an enclosure to the application, since the application without the enclosure will also be placed in the Public Document Room. If we do not hear from you in this regard within the specified period, the report will be placed in the Public Document Room.

Should you have any questions concerning this inspection we will be pleased to discuss them with you.
