Dear Administrative Judges:

In ALAB-788 issued by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board on October 31, 1384, the Appeal Board required the NRC Staff to advise the Licensing Board (with copies served on all parties) whether any non-safety related electrical equipment at Shoreham falls within the category defined by 10 CFR § 50.49(b)(2) and, if so, the basis for the Staff's approval. (ALAB-788 at slip op. 105)

In compliance with the Appeal Board's requirement, the Staff respectfully refers the Licensing Board's attention to Section 3.11.3 of the Shoreham SSER 7, issued in September, 1984.* In particular, Section 3.11.3.1 of SSER 7 describes the Staff's determination that no equipment at Shoreham falls into the category defined by $10 \text{ CFR } \S50.49(b)(2)$. Additionally, the basis for the Staff's determination in this regard is fully set forth in Section 3.11.3.1. Copies of the relevant pages of SSER 7 are attached for the convenience of the Board and parties.

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^{*} The Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) advises Staff Counsel that a copy of SSER 7 was mailed to the Licensing Board, the Appeal Board, and all parties on or about October 1, 1984.

The Staff is of the view, on the basis of SSER 7 and this letter, that the Staff and the Licensing Board have fully discharged the requirement placed on us by virtue of ALAB-788 (at page 105).

With respect to the matters involving the resolution of Unresolved Safety Issue (USI) A-47 and "housekeeping" also discussed in ALAB-788 at pages 57-59 and 75, respectively, the Staff is preparing appropriate affidavits to respond to these matters. We believe the affidavit relating to "housekeeping" can be filed with the Board in approximately one week. The affidavit relating to USI A-47 will be filed as soon after the "housekeeping" affidavit as possible. Counsel will provide a more specific date after NRR has had an opportunity to assess the matters raised in ALAB-788.
