Subject: Relief Request - ASME Code Section XI Requirements (Virgil C. Summer Nuclear Station, Unit 1)

By letter dated August 1, 1984, you requested relief from the hydrostatic testing after modifications to ASME Code Class 2 piping. In lieu of the required hydrostatic tests, you proposed nondestructive examination consisting of surface and visual examination of the welds.

We have determined that relief from the hydrostatic tests required by Section XI is justifiable. The alternative examinations and test proposed by you in lieu of the hydrostatic test requirement will provide assurance of the structural integ, ty of the piping following the modification. Relief is granted pursuant to paragraph 10 CFR 50.55a(g)(6)(i) based on our finding that (1) certain specific requirements of Section XI of the ASME Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code, 1977 Edition through Summer 1978 Addenda are impractical and (2) such relief is authorized by law, will not endanger life or property or the common defense and security and is otherwise in the public interest giving due consideration to the burden upon the licensee if such relief were not granted. Our Safety Evaluation Report is enclosed. Also enclosed for your information is the related Federal Register Notice.
