RESPONSE TO THE NRC GENERIC LETTER 95-07, "PRESSURE LOCKING AND THERMAL BINDING OF SAFETY-RELATED POWER-OPERATED GATE VALVES"

Gentlemen:

On August 17, 1995, the NRC issued Generic Letter (GL) 95-07, "Pressure Locking and Thermal Binding of Safety-Related Power-Operated Gate Valves." In our December 6, 1995 submittal (Serial: BSEP 95-0619), CP&L agreed to provide within 180 days from the date of the generic letter, a summary of the valves identified as susceptible to pressure locking or thermal binding and a schedule for corrective actions. CP&L's February 13, 1996 letter (Serial: BSEP 96-0051) provided this response, and indicated a follow-up response would be submitted prior to April 26, 1996. CP&L has completed the analysis of the thermal environment on the existing High Pressure Coolant Injection (HPCI) Inboard Suppression Pool Suction Valve (1/2-E41-F042) configuration and determined that these valves are not subject to thermally-induced pressure locking. Accordingly, no modification or further investigation is required.

The remaining corrective actions from CP&L's February 13, 1996 response remain on schedule and are restated in enclosure 1.
